Dept. 01 Dairy Cattle

1. Dairy Cattle exhibitors will be paid \$100 per head for animals over 6 months old and for the 8-day duration of the fair. For exhibitors for whom an 8-day commitment is too much we now offer a 4-day duration. You may choose from opening Thursday thru Sunday or Thursday thru closing Sunday. These exhibitors will be paid \$50 per head for animals over 6 months old.
2. All animals will be subject to inspections shortly after arrival. Any animals that in the judgement of the Fair management should not be displayed, will be sent home.
3. The Superintendent reserves the right to limit entries and to balance the number of dairy breeds to promote varied display. Entries are due and stated date with preference to prior year exhibitors.
4. Exhibitor Award goes to the livestock exhibitor who excels in the following area:
Agricultural Promotion, Animal Husbandry, and positive interaction with fellow exhibitors, patrons and staff.

Dept. 02 Youth Dairy Show

Our youth shows are open to all youth, however to be eligible for premiums you must own or lease your animal.

1. Each exhibitor is limited to one entry in each class for each breed.
2. In Fitting & Showmanship classes a calf or yearling must be used unless a cow is the only animal the exhibitor has to show.

1. Novice Showmanship – Under the age of 8
2. Junior Showmanship – Ages 8 to 13
3. Senior Showmanship – Ages 14-21
4. Spring Heifer Calf – March 1 to April 30
5. Winter Heifer Calf – December 1 to February 28
6. Fall Heifer Calf – September 1 to November 30
7. Summer Yearling Heifer – June 1 to August 30
8. Spring Yearling Heifer – March 1 to May 31
9. Winter Yearling Heifer – December 1 to February 28
10. Fall Yearling Heifer – September 1 to November 30 (not in milk yearlings that have calved will show as a two-year-old)
11. Junior Champion – Winners of Class 5 thru 11 Rosette Awarded, no premium.
12. Two-Year-Old Cow – September 1 to August 31
13. Three-Year-Old Cow – September 1 to August 31
14. Four-Year-Old Cow or Older – Born on or before August 31
15. Dry Cow – any cow that has calved, but is not in milk and not shown in any of the above classes.
16. Senior Champion Cow – Winners of classes 13, 14 and 15. Rosette Awarded, no premium.
17. Grand Champion – Winners of 12 and 16. Rosette awarded, no premium.
18. Produce of Dam – Two females, any age, the produce of one cow, one owner.
19. Dam and Daughter – A cow and one daughter, any age, one owner. (compromised 2 dam/daughter groups)
20. Herd – 3 females, any age, of same breed owned by exhibitor. One entry per exhibitor.

21. Herdsmanship – Exhibitors will be judged on the cleanliness and appearance of the animals and politeness and informative attitude toward the public. (The care and feeding of the animals is sole responsibility of the exhibitor).

Dept. 03 Beef Cattle

1. Beef cattle exhibitors will be paid \$100 per head for animals over 6 months old and for the 8-day duration of the fair.
2. All animals will be subject to inspections shortly after arrival. Any animal that in the judgement of the fair management should not be displayed will be sent home.
3. The Superintendent reserves the right to limit entries and to balance the number of dairy breeds to promote varied display. Entries are due and stated date with preference to priory year exhibitors.
4. Exhibitor Award goes to the livestock exhibitor who excels in the following area: Agricultural Promotion, Animal Husbandry, and positive interaction with fellow exhibitors, patrons and staff.

Dept. 04 Youth Beef Show

1. Each exhibitor is limited to one entry in each class for each breed.
2. In Fitting & Showmanship classes a calf or yearling must be used unless a cow is the only animal the exhibitor has to show.

Dept. 05 Sheep Exhibit

1. Sheep exhibitors will be paid \$85.00 per head for animals penned from listed dates and times.
2. Due to limited space the superintendent reserves the right to limit the number of entries to allow for more exhibitors. Previous years exhibitors, who participate in the educational activities will be given seniority over other exhibitors.
3. All animals are subject to a veterinary inspection shortly after arrival. Any animal that in the judgement of the fair management should not be displayed will be sent home.

Dept. 06 Youth Sheep Show

1. This show is open to children under the age of 21.
2. Show staff will conduct health checks on all animals as they are unloaded.
3. Grade animals are not eligible for ram classes. Grade males will be shown with the market lamb class. Youth not having purebred animals may show their grade ewes as "Commercial Ewes".
4. Market lambs must have permanent identification. Market lambs are not eligible for breed classes.
5. Only one entry per class per breed will be shown. Do not bring more than one animal per class per breed. Limited to two breeds per exhibitor.
6. All sheep must be clean and prepared properly for the breed or function.
7. An animal used in lead-line or showmanship must be shown in one of the other classes.
8. Halters are to be worn for showmanship classes but are optional for type classes.
9. In all breed and owned classes papers must be shown in the ring. Entries in group classes must have been shown in the individual classes.

15. Pair of Ewes – one lamb and one yearling, bred and owned by the exhibitor.
16. Get of Sire – three animals bred and owned by the exhibitor.

18. Overall Ewe Champion – Rosette
19. Market Lamb – May be grouped by weight.

21. Shepherds Class – Exhibitors will be judged during the fair on cleanliness of pen and pen area, cleanliness and appearance of sheep, contribution to appearance of general area, care of their own animals, and politeness and informative attitude toward the public.

Dept. 07 Goat Exhibit

1. Goat exhibitors will be paid \$60.00 per head for animals penned from the listed times and dates.
2. Due to limited space the superintendent reserves the right to limit the number of entries to allow for more exhibitors. Previous exhibitors, who participate in the educational activities will be given seniority over other exhibitors.
3. All animals are subject to a veterinary inspection shortly after arrival. Any animal that in the judgment of the fair management should not be displayed will be sent home.

Dept. 08 Poultry Exhibit

1. Poultry exhibitors will be paid \$12.00 per bird for display during the duration of the fair.
2. Due to limited space the superintendent reserves the right to limit the number of entries to allow for more exhibitors. Previous exhibitors, who participate in the educational activities will be given seniority over other exhibitors.
3. All animals are subject to a veterinary inspection shortly after arrival. Any animal that in the judgment of the fair management should not be displayed will be sent home.

Dept. 09 Rabbit Exhibit

1. Rabbit exhibitors will be paid \$12.00 per rabbit for display during the duration of the fair.
2. Due to limited space the superintendent reserves the right to limit the number of entries to allow for more exhibitors. Previous exhibitors, who participate in the educational activities will be given seniority over other exhibitors.
3. All animals are subject to a veterinary inspection shortly after arrival. Any animal that in the judgment of the fair management should not be displayed will be sent home.

Dept. 10 Swine Exhibit

1. Swine exhibitors will be paid \$30.00 per head for animals penned from listed dates and times.
2. Due to limited space the superintendent reserves the right to limit the number of entries to allow for more exhibitors. Previous exhibitors, who participate in the educational activities will be given seniority over other exhibitors.
3. All animals are subject to a veterinary inspection shortly after arrival. Any animal that in the judgment of the fair management should not be displayed will be sent home.

Dept. 11 Youth Swine Show

1. Open to all children under the age of 21.
2. All swine project exhibits must have proper identification either in the form of a tattoo or ear notching and so noted on the approval sheet.
3. No exhibitor will strike another animal while using the show ring.
4. All animals must be shown as individuals in the ring except sow and litter. The superintendent reserves the right to excuse unruly pigs from the ring. (animals still eligible for a prize).

General Rules: Open Competition

1. No Riders anywhere on the Fair Grounds.
2. No Duals or Chains, Not allowed.
3. No step on sled allowed at any time.
4. No four wheel drive tractors (However, 4 wheel drive is permitted on Unlimited Class Only).
5. Cut tires and radials allowed (With exception of duals and chains)

6. Any bolt-on or secured weights are permitted. If any weight comes off during pulling the tractor will be disqualified.
7. The pulling point face will not exceed 20" in height and not less than 18" from the center axel (18" measurement is from the back of hole), (20" measurement shall be at highest pulling face). Including washers or spacers to attain height.
8. When hooking on the drag, drivers will put the tractors in neutral, raise hands and remain seated during the pull.
9. All tractors must have working brakes.
10. Drivers must have valid driver's license. Those under the age of 18 must have written parental/guardian permission and supervised by said person.
11. No alcohol to be consumed during pull.
12. Only one person allowed on the tractor.
13. Attention shall be given to the hook person and the flag person.
14. Tractors may have two tries to achieve full pull. Pin must fall completely to be classified as a full pull. Measurements shall be taken from the mark on the pin to the rear center of the drag.
15. One driver per class per tractor. Not to exceed two classes with the same tractor (No Switching).
16. Spectators shall stay at least 30 feet from the edge of the track. They may be closer if solid barrier or fence separates spectators from the track.
17. No coaching at any time unless a junior event or a mechanical breakdown.

Dept. 15 Girl Scouts

The members exhibiting must have been registered as a Girl Scout when the project was completed. Although the association does exercise as much care as possible, we assume no responsibility for loss or damage and exhibits entered at the member's risk. Any exhibits left after the departure date and time will be disposed of.

Only under these conditions will exhibits be accepted:

Dept. 16 Cub & Boy Scouts

- Articles exhibited must represent work since last September and not have been exhibited in the Boy/Cub Scout exhibit at the Rochester Fair in the past. Items can be from school, camps, home, scouts, or anywhere else. The only rule is that the exhibitor must have been registered with the BSA when the project was created. Tiger Cubs through Adult leaders. Superintendent reserves the right to limit entries in any category due to space limitations. Division is determined by the exhibitors scouting level as of last September. Division for scouts joining after September is the level at which they joined.
- All entries must be pre-registered by the listed date. Registered entries may be brought to the Fairgrounds Exhibition Building at the Scouts Exhibit: (See dates and times schedule) 4
- Exhibits submitted must be clean, whole, and complete. All paint must be dry. Exhibits are to be age/rank appropriate. The guidelines of the BSA will be taken into consideration as to the appropriateness of the exhibits. No Lego constructions.
- Exhibits will be judged on creativity, quality, skill, and age level. Judges have the option of disqualifying any item deemed inappropriate to the exhibitor's abilities.
- Due to limited space, we may not have enough room for larger items. Contact superintendents prior to pre-registering for any items larger than a display board.
- Adults may enter any class and receive ribbons but do not receive premiums.

Art: Paintings, drawings, and sculpted items. All paintings and drawings must be at least 5x7, matted, framed, or on art canvas. Prefer no glass. Drawings may be submitted that do not follow the above criteria will be for display only, space permitting.

Acceptance Criteria

Wood: No items created from kits are acceptable. All wooden parts are to have been cut, shaped, sanded, finished, etc. by entrant. Exception is made for minor turned parts such as dowels, knobs, etc.

Fasteners: In general, fasteners should not be visible. This is particularly true for nails. Screws for hinges, locks, and other typically metal parts are allowed. For reproductions and period pieces, cut nails may be visible as style allows/requires.

Techniques: Entries should display about average joinery techniques with fine joint lines and tight joints. Typically, joints such as dovetails, mortises, thru Tenon, and bridal joints are used.

Finish: All items should be fully finished in accordance with the styles of each piece. All surfaces should be smooth and pleasant to touch. Exceptions are made for work that should show hand tooling as Early American, or for artistic purposes. No rough edges or unfinished pieces are accepted.

Fine woodworking items are judged on originality or adherence to reproduction styles and standards, technical merit, and finish

Dept. 20 Giant Pumpkin

1. The loading and/or unloading of all pumpkins is solely the responsibility of the entrant. Rochester Fair Association and its employees are not required to load and/or unload your entry.
2. For purposes of competition a pumpkin will be considered an vegetable of the Cucurbita Pepo or Cucurbita Maxima family that is mostly orange, pale orange, orange yellow, or cream color with a slight orange cast. If pumpkin is mostly green or gray it will considered a squash. Where a question on color or qualification exists the superintendent will make the final ruling.
3. The winner will be judged by weight alone. Circumference, shape, or general appearance has no bearing on the competition.
4. All pumpkins must be grown in New England. The Grower must be present at competition. No extra weight or foreign objects may be added to the pumpkin. The superintendent reserves the right to inspect or probe any pumpkin to determine that the pumpkin is in good physical condition and that no foreign objects have been added. Refusal to allow this inspection will dis-qualify you for competition.
5. The vine must be trimmed to within two (2) inches of the pumpkin stem. If the stem is broken off at the competition, it will be allowed to be weighed with the pumpkin.
6. Occasionally, a ruling must be made by the Agricultural Superintendent that may not specifically be stated in the rules and regulations of this contest. These rulings will be made on a case by case basis and ALL DECISIONS are FINAL.
7. Lifting tarps will be inspected and given a tarp weight before the competition.
8. Pumpkins must be in good physical condition to qualify for premiums. Small scratches, dents, scuffs, woodchuck bites, etc., will be allowed at the discretion of the Superintendent, as long as they do not threaten the structural integrity of the pumpkin. Any pumpkin with a hole that exposes the internal cavity or is severely leaking, or soft pumpkins on the verge of collapse will be disqualified.
9. Any pumpkins with a soft spot will not be accepted regardless of the size of the soft spot.
10. All pumpkins entered must remain at the Fair from the day of the entry until the last day.
11. The Rochester Fair Association and its employees are not responsible for the loss and damage to any entry in the department.

Pumpkin weigh-in will begin at 10:00am on September 8, 2018 with unloading starting at 8:00am. Pumpkins must stay on-site until Monday, September 17, 2018.
